Services, Support, and resources are responsive to the changing needs of children and their families



Families and Early Intervention staff work as a team to develop a plan with outcomes and strategies appropriate for the unique needs of a child. The team may recommend services from the following list to support and assist families in meeting their child's individualized plan.

- Service coordination
- Parent training, counseling and home visits
- Screening, evaluation, and assessment
- Family need assessment
- Assistive technology & devices
- Audiology services
- Medical diagnostic/evaluation services
- Nutrition services
- Occupational therapy
- Speech-language therapy
- Physical therapy
- Social work services
- Special instruction
- Transition services
- Vision services

The Early Intervention programs are provided at no cost to the family. Since Early Intervention is the payer of last resort for services, to maximize services, funding is sought from a variety of sources including Medicaid and other private insurance providers. Families are asked to provide billing information but never billed for unpaid balances.

## Early Intervention Services

Early Intervention is available to families with children with developmental delays between the ages of birth and three years. Early intervention services are provided in natural environments, including home, playgroup and community settings. Families join together with Early Intervention staff to develop and Individualized Family Services Plan, with outcomes that draw on the family's priorities and concerns. Strategies incorporate a child's individual strengths are developed so families can use them during their daily routines. Transition services are provided to families when their children turn three in order to ensure they receive continuous intervention in community or school district settings.
